2019 TORBAY SAILING CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS NOTICE OF RACE

28TH APRIL AND 5TH MAY 2019

Waiake Beach, North Shore, Auckland The organising authority is the Torbay Sailing Club

NB: The notation '[DP]' in a rule in the Notice of Race means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing
- 1.2 The Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations Part 1 shall apply
- 1.3 The sailing instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions, and supplementary sailing instructions that will be on the official noticeboard and on the website at www.torbaysailing.club/rsfevanats.

2. ELIGIBILITY

- 2.1 The regatta is open to all classes. A minimum of 4 boats will be required to have their own start.
- 2.2 Boats intending on racing must enter by no later than the briefing for that given day.
- 2.3 To be eligible to be awarded club champion status, the sailor(s) of the boat shall be a financial member of Torbay Sailing Club.
- 2.4 To be eligible to be awarded club champion status, the sailor(s) of the boat shall have sailed at least one race of the Torbay Sailing Club pre-xmas series, and at least one race of the post-xmas series in their chosen class.
- 2.5 does not apply to the Weta and Splash classes.

ADVERTISING

3.1 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organising authority. If this rule is broken, World Sailing Regulation 20.9.2 applies. [DP]

4. ENTRY FEE

4.1 The entry fee is free for club members, and \$20 per day for non-club members.

5. SCHEDULE

5.1 Registration:

28th April 2019: 0800 - 0930 5th May 2019: 0800 - 0930

5.2 Dates of racing and number of races:

- 5.3 Briefing will take place before racing on both scheduled race days at 0930 hrs.
- 5.4 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race each day is 1030 hrs.
- 5.5 On any scheduled day of racing no warning signal will be made after 1530 hrs.

6. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

6.1 Appendix S shall apply.

The Supplementary Sailing Instructions will be available on the official regatta noticeboard and TSC Members App.

Paper copies will not be issued to competitors.

7. VENUE

- 7.1 The host club is Torbay Sailing Club, 948 Beach Road, Waiake Beach, Auckland.
- 7.2 The racing will take place on course area B, as shown in Attachment A, on the waters off Waiake Beach, North Shore.

8. COURSES

8.1 The courses will be outlined in the Sailing Instructions

9. PENALTY SYSTEM

9.1 For all classes rule 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

10. SCORING

- 10.1 Eight (8) races are scheduled.
- 10.2 Three (3) races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

10.3

- a. When fewer than five (5) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- b. When five (5) to eight (8) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

11. SAFETY

- 11.1 Competitors shall wear a life jacket or other adequate personal bouyancy at all times when afloat.
- 11.2 Wet suits and dry suits do not constitute adequate personal bouyancy.
- 11.3 All support and safety boat crews are required to wear life jackets under the Auckland City life jacket By Law.

12. LAUNCHING

- 12. 1 All boats will be required to launch and retrieve from Waiake Beach.
- 12.2 Beach trolleys shall be prominently marked with the boat's sail number.

13. COACH AND SUPPORT BOATS

13.1 Support boats are welcome but must stay outside 50m from the fleet except before the warning signal and after the finish. In a case of emergency, they may be asked to assist. All support boats are required to register via the online form on the website www.torbaysailing.club/rsfevanats.

14. RADIO COMMUNICATIONS

14.1 Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones. [DP]

15. PRIZES

- 15.1 Prizes will be given as follows:
 - (a) 1st (Club Champion), 2nd, 3rd in the following classes:
 - Optimist Crunchie
 - Optimist Green
 - Optimist Open
 - Starlings
 - Laser Radial
 - Laser
 - J14
 - Weta
 - Splash
 - RS Feva
 - (b) And 1st (Club Champion), 2nd, 3rd in any classes not listed in 15.1(a)

16. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

16.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organising authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

17. RIGHTS TO USE NAME & LIKENESS

17.1 By participating in the event, a competitor automatically grants to the Organising Authority and the sponsors of the event, the right in perpetuity, to make, use and show, from time to time and at the discretion, any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or film television and other reproductions of him/her during the period of the competition for said event in which the competitor participated and in all material related to the said event without compensation.

18. USE OF DRONE FOR MEDIA

18.1 All those who take part in the regatta as competitors as well as support crew or spectators agree to be overflown by a drone during the duration of the event, this includes your person and your property (boats).


